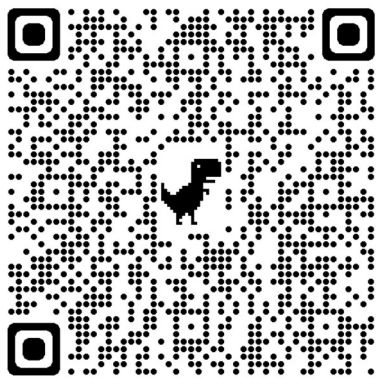

40 crimes reported during June

Humbertalking has set our priorities, this month we are to:

- 1. Tackling Anti-Social Behaviour**
- 2. Improve Road Safety around our schools.**



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Here's a summary of crimes that have been reported across Mid Holderness last month:

- a. **Domestic Related incidents:** (eighteen investigations)
Domestic Assault x4, Rape x1, Harassment x9, Controlling & Coercive behaviour x 2, Damage x1 other x1
- b. **Residential Burglary reports:** (One investigation)
13/06/2026 Burglary Catwick Lane, **LONG RISTON** entered via open front window of unoccupied property, used cooker to heat food/seek shelter.
- c. **Business Burglary reports:** (no reports)
- d. **Thefts:** (two investigations)
07/06/2026 Theft A165, **BURTON PIDSEA** – theft of a cat.
07/06/2026 Theft Drove Lane, **WAWNE** – two garden milk churn ornaments
- e. **Vehicle Crime:** (one investigation)
17/06/2026 Theft of vehicle Main Road, **BILTON**
- f. **Damage:** (five investigation)
01/06/2026 Damage to door Dorset Avenue, **SKIRLAUGH**
10/06/2026 Damage to fencing Sproatley Road, **FLINTON**
14/06/2026 Damage Humbleton Road, **FITLING** – spray paint graffiti to building
14/06/2026 Damage Humbleton Road, **FITLING** – spray paint on tractor/shed
24/06/2026 Damage to crops, **GREAT HATFIELD** (nighttime poaching)

13 incidents - public order x1, assault x2, harassment x2, harassment by neighbour(s) x4, dangerous dog x1, Fraud x2, Malicious Communications x1 reported in June across the Mid Holderness ward area.



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Humber-talking has set our priorities, this month we are to:

1. Tackling Anti-Social Behaviour

We regularly deploy high visibility patrols to our communities in response to reports of criminal damage, drug dealing and anti-social behaviour.



The local policing team have also had productive meetings with partners from East Riding Council, Parish Councils and Neighbourhood Watch groups to listen to community concerns.

Our officers are also committed to eradicating the harm that the illegal and anti-social use of off-road bikes cause to the communities through our Operation Yellowfin.

Action – aims to:

- Protect vulnerable residents
- Restore community confidence and create a safer environment
- Demonstrate the effectiveness of a partnership approach between with local partners.

Intended outcome:

- Reduce the number of ASB reports
- Increase residents' confidence and feeling of safety

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2. Improve Road Safety – around our schools.

As with most other areas, road safety is something in which we can improve upon in our rural communities.

Action –

- As we enter the summer months, members of the Holderness Policing Team will continue to be out and about policing our roads to promote safe behaviour and enforcement of traffic laws.
- Officers will continue to support Bilton & Aldbrough Primary Schools to reduce traffic in the villages and encourage families to walk or cycle to school.

Intended outcome:

The intended outcomes are to:

- Education & awareness campaigns to reduce the number of casualties on our roads.
- Create a culture of road safety where individuals understand and practices safe behaviours.



With the last few weeks of all children at our primary schools before the Summer Holidays, the Community Team will be conducting patrols around the schools making sure that the roads are safe for everyone especial for our young members outside the schools' gates.



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How you can help

Your local Neighbourhood Policing Team appreciates the importance of being in the right place, at the right time, for the right reasons to reassure the public, improve public confidence and reduce crime and anti-social behaviour in the area in which we all live and work.

We encourage all residents to call and report any issues where they live so that we can deal with any issues and step up our patrols in that area.

OP COASTLINE

To help keep communities safe, local neighbourhood policing teams, the Rural Task Force, and the Community Safety Unit will be out on high visibility patrols and engaging with those across the area. Our Roads Policing unit will be actively patrolling key routes, using both marked and unmarked vehicles, to tackle and deter crime and antisocial behaviour.



WHAT IS ANTI SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR?

Anti-social behaviour is defined by the Anti-Social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014 as 'acting in a manner that caused, or was likely to cause, harassment, alarm or distress to any persons.'

WHAT TYPES OF ASB ARE THERE?

Personal: When a person targets a specific individual or group

Nuisance: When a person causes trouble, annoyance or suffering to a community

Environmental: When a person's actions affect the wider environment, such as public spaces or buildings

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Working with partner agencies to reduce drowning and serious injuries. The Humber region is dominated by a long stretch of coastline and a large tidal river splitting it in two. Follow our advice to stay safe in and around water, whether it be the sea, a lake, a river, or a reservoir:

- Obey any warning and safety signs
- If you are going out on your own, let someone know where you are going and when you are coming back
- Look out for trip or slip hazards around water and stick to proper pathways
- Remember riverbanks and cliff edges may be unstable and give way

What to do if someone falls into deep water

If you see someone struggling in the water, never jump in yourself. Instead, remember these steps to save a life:

1. **Phone:** Dial 999 immediately
2. **Float:** Tell the person in the water to stay calm and float on their back
3. **Throw:** Give them rescue equipment or anything that floats

Use **What3Words app** to help emergency services find you. The app helps to pinpoint your location within a 3m square using a unique three-word address. This helps 999 call handlers to pass on your location to our firefighters and other emergency responders.
